Violations of international law and precedents in solution of Yugoslav crisis

According to the theory and provisions of the international war law code prisoners of war are the disarmed enemy soldiers. The most significant legal regulations on prisoners of war are the Geneva Convention on Treatment of Prisoners of War, of August 12th, 1949, and its Additional Protocol of 1977.

Prisoners of war are protected by the following three provisions of the Criminal Law Code of the FRY: prohibition of perpetrations of war crimes against them; prohibition of cruel treatment of the wounded, ill and prisoners of war; and prohibition of unjustified postponement of repatriation of prisoners of war.
